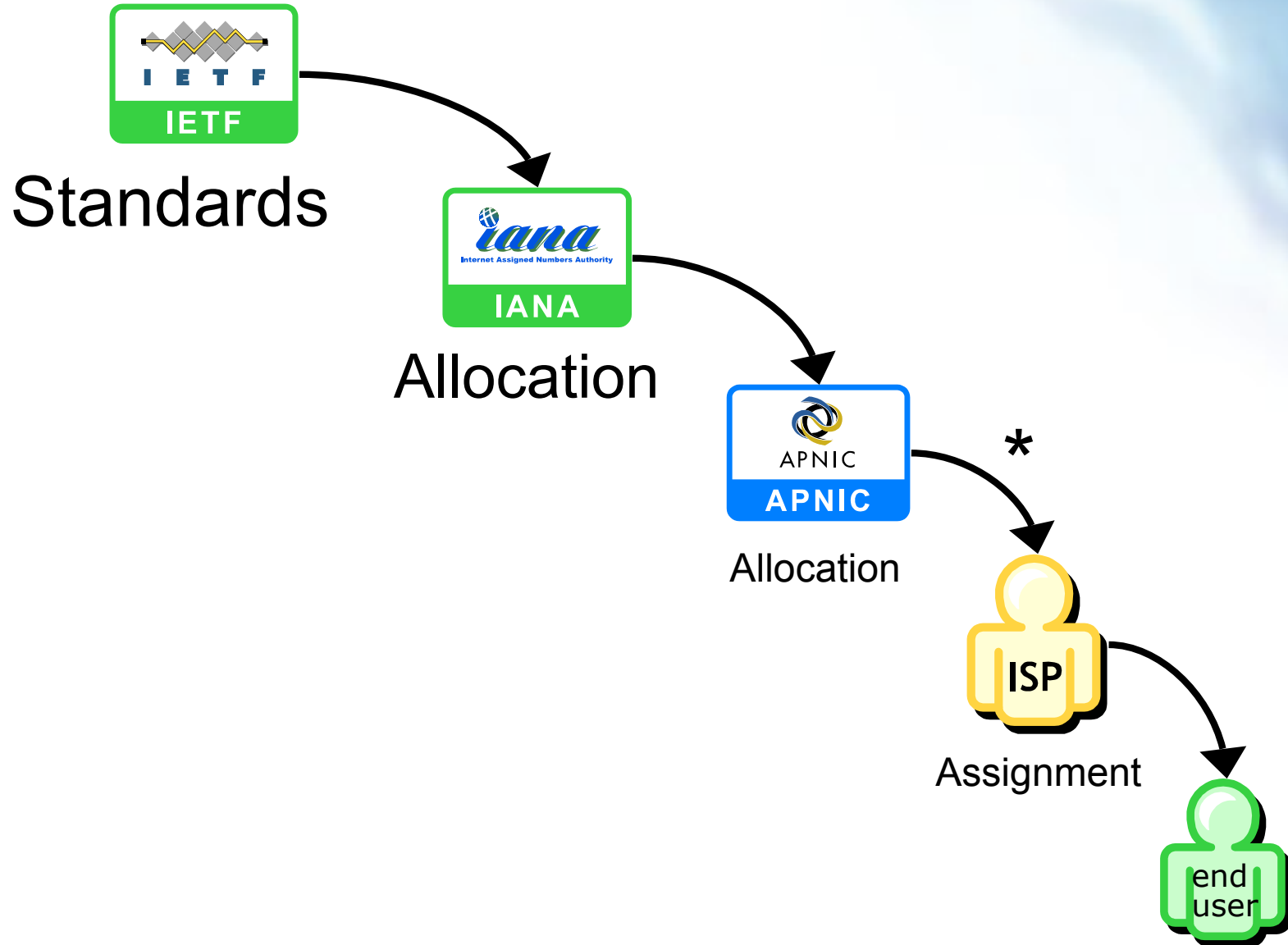

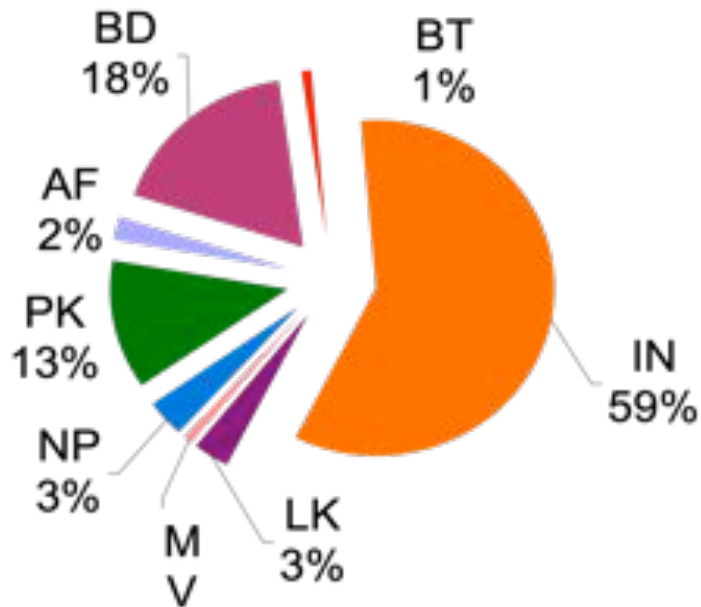
# What's an IP Address?

- Internet infrastructure addresses
- Uniquely assigned to Internet endpoints
- Usage is publicly registered
- Addresses are a finite “Common Resource”
- Addresses are “IPv4” or “IPv6”
  - IPv4: 4 billion unique addresses
  - IPv6: 256 million trillion addresses?

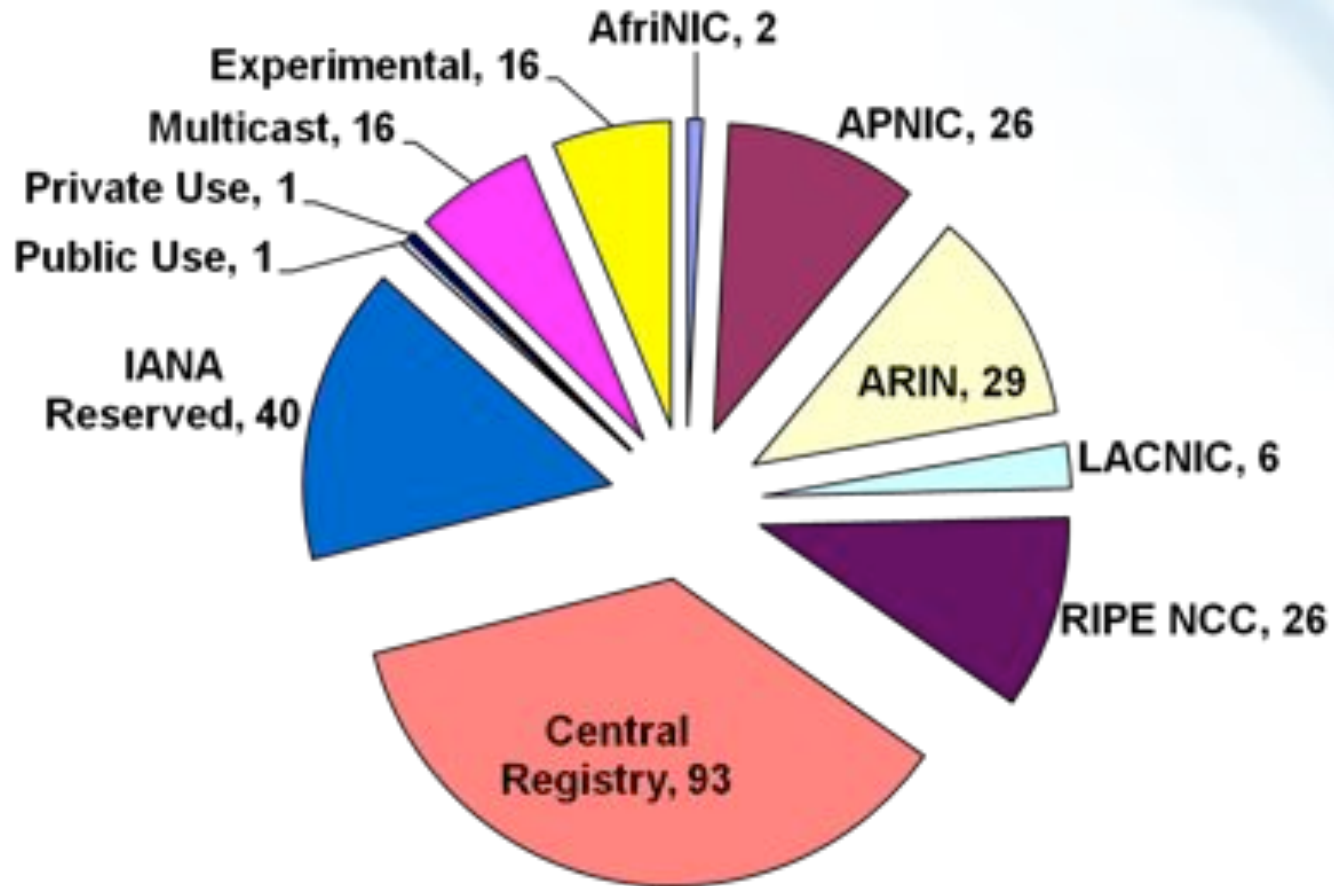

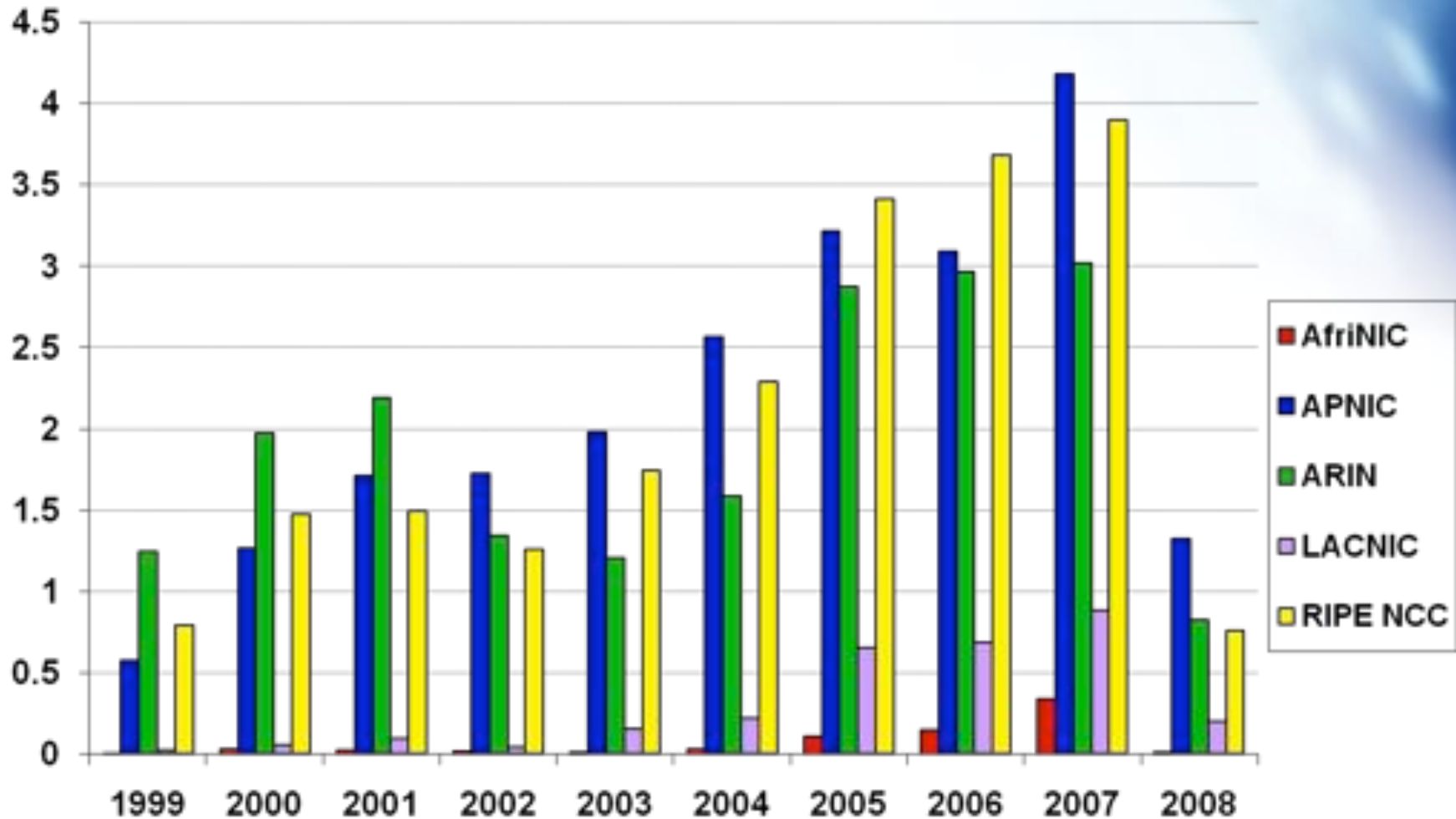
# Distribution of IPv4 /8 blocks



Total /8 blocks: 256

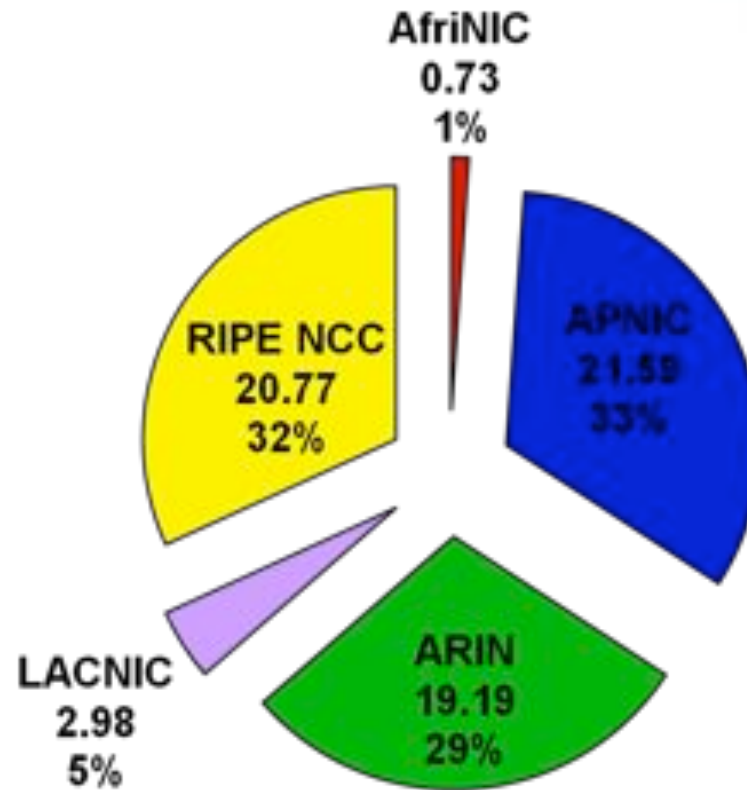
# IPv4 allocations RIRs to LIRs/ISPs

Cumulative total (Jan 1999 – Mar 2008)

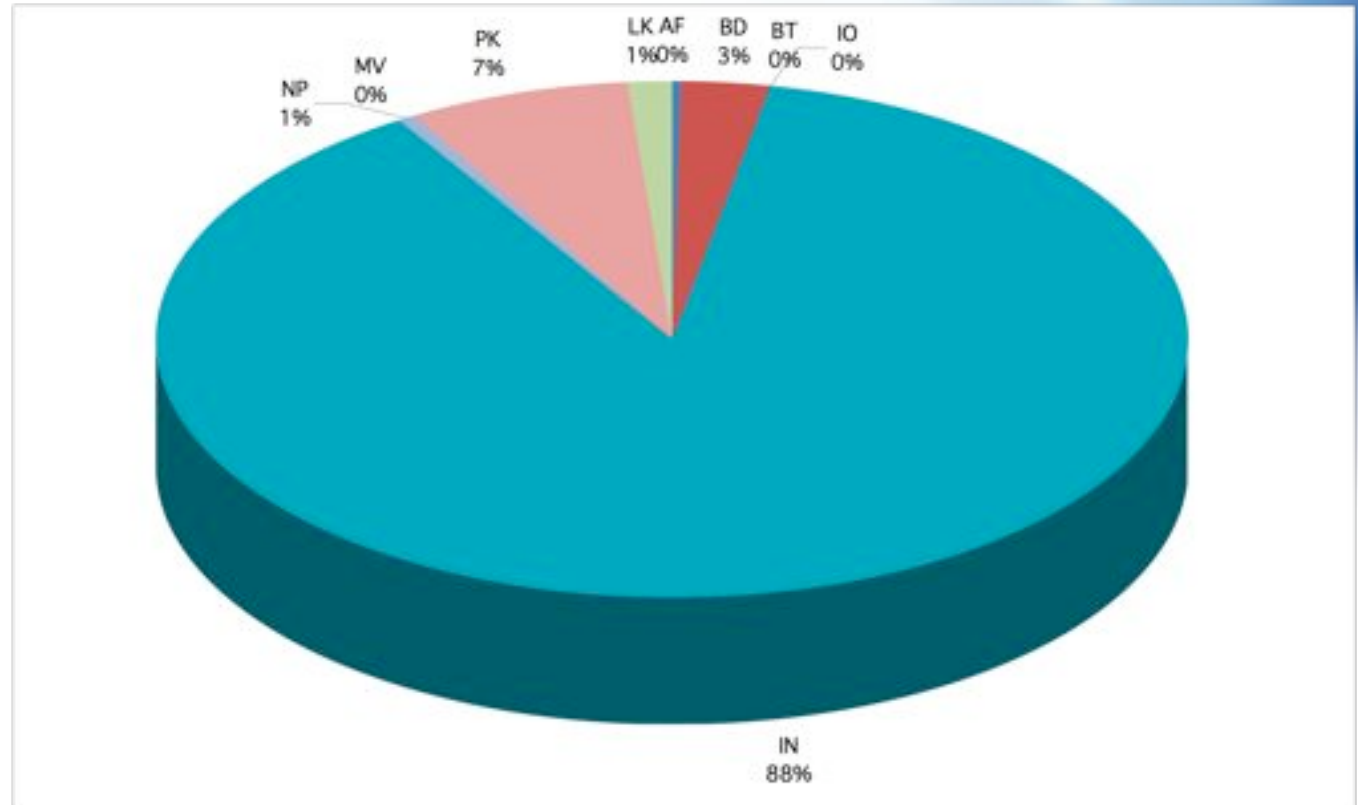

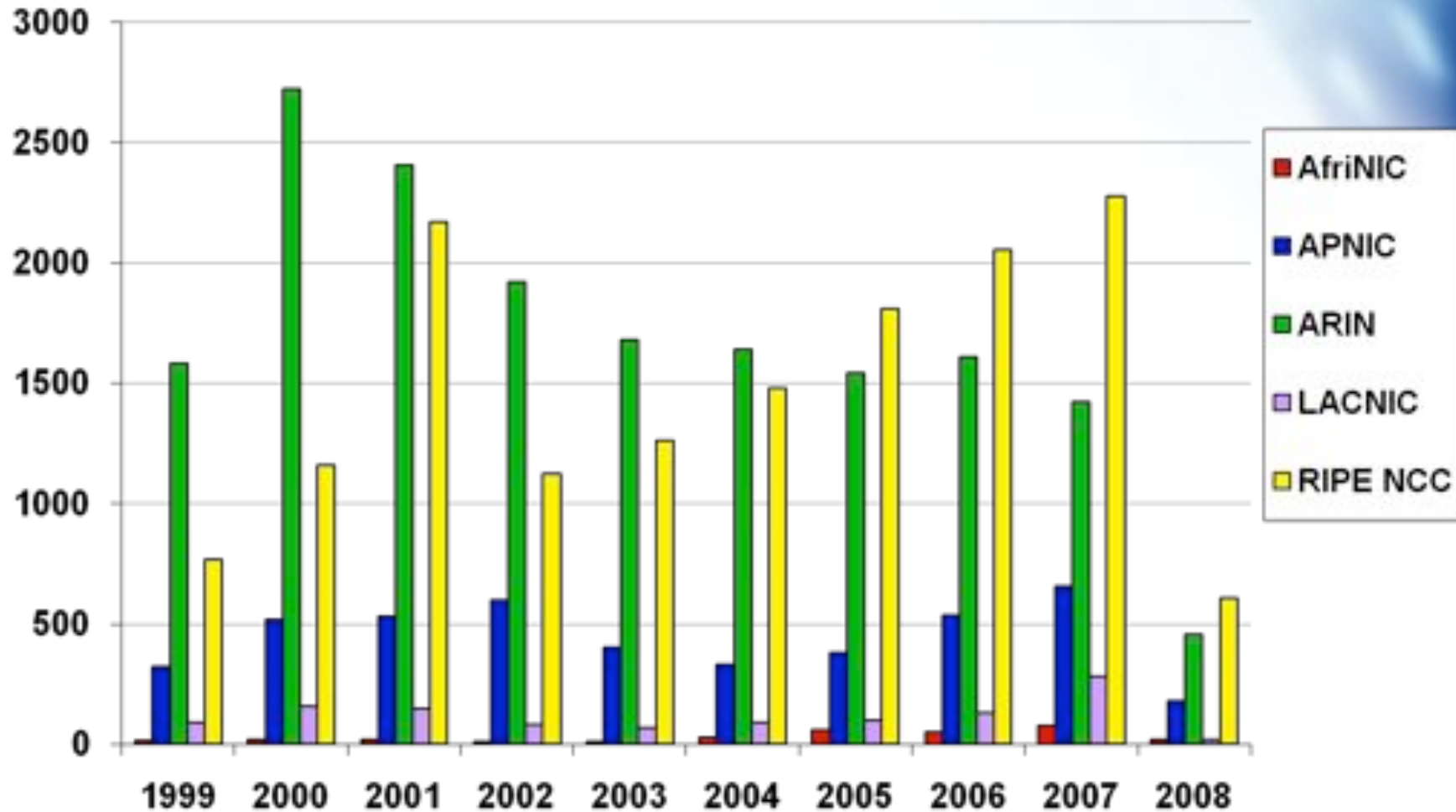

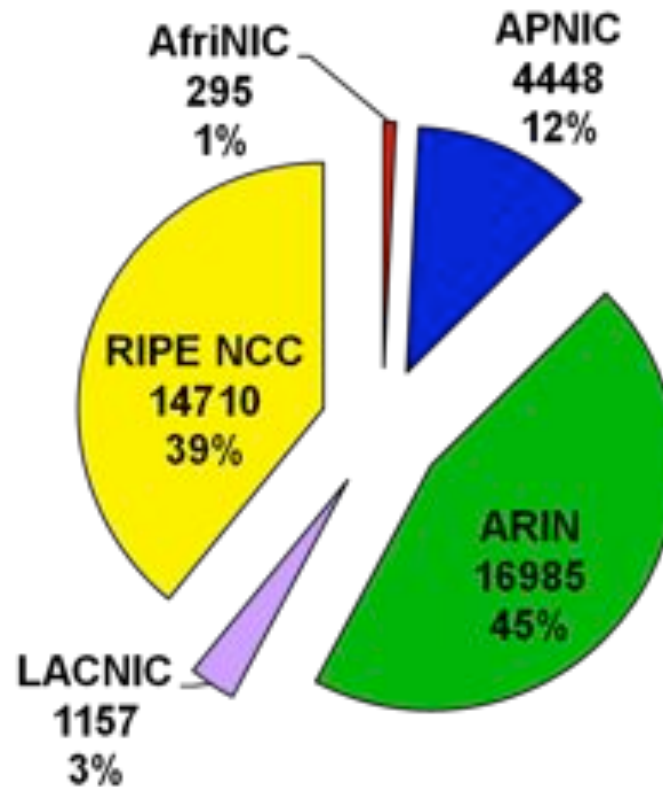
# ASN assignments: RIRs to LIRs/ISPs

Yearly comparison - data up to Mar 2008



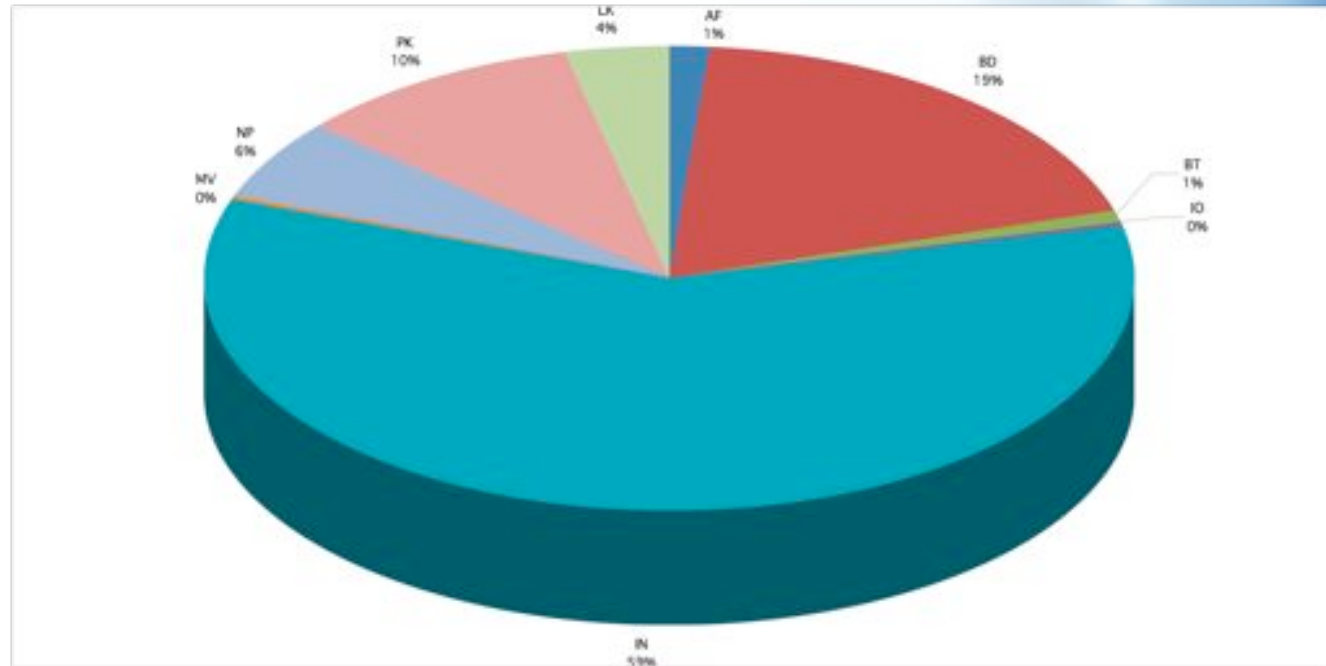

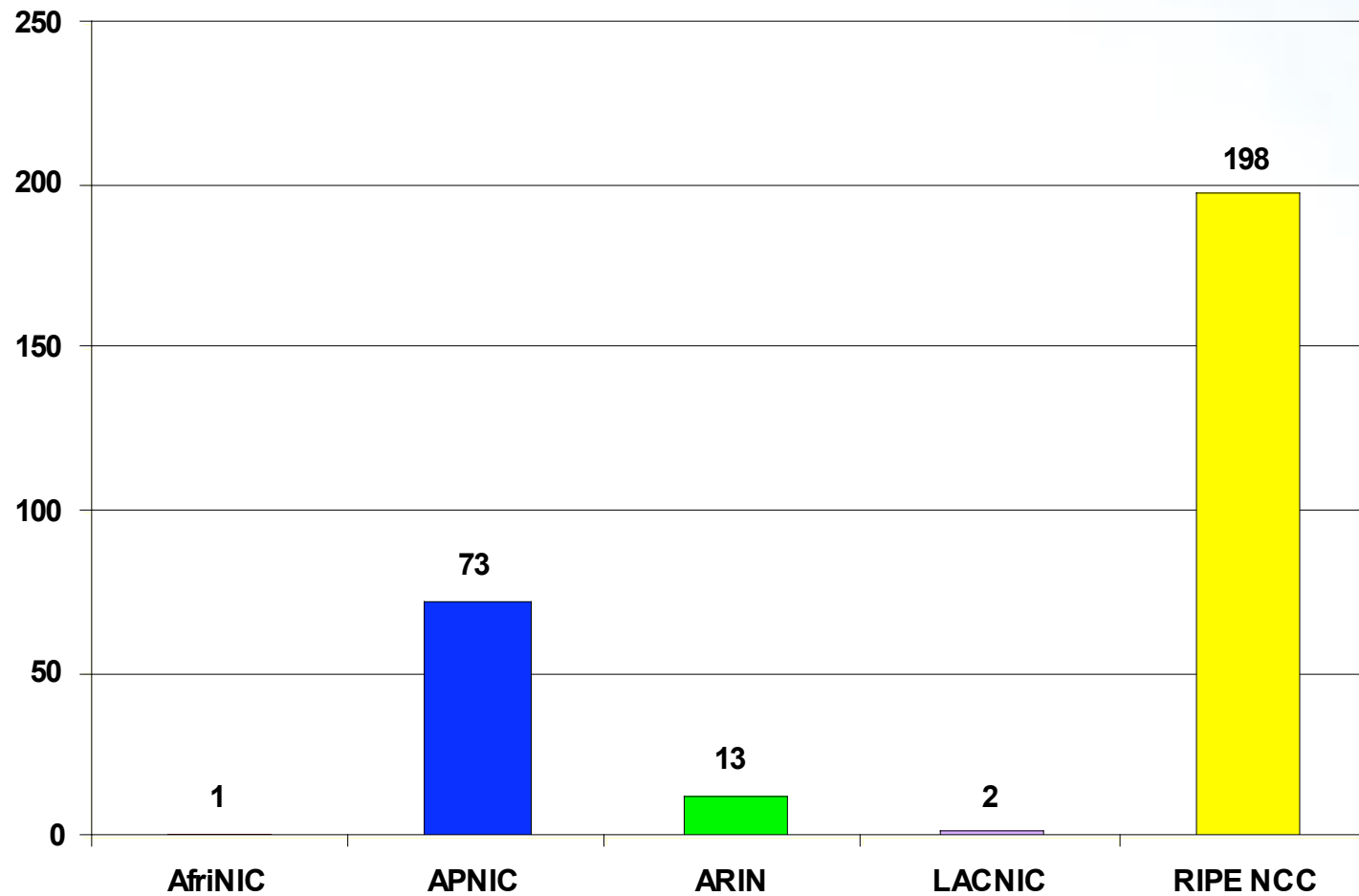

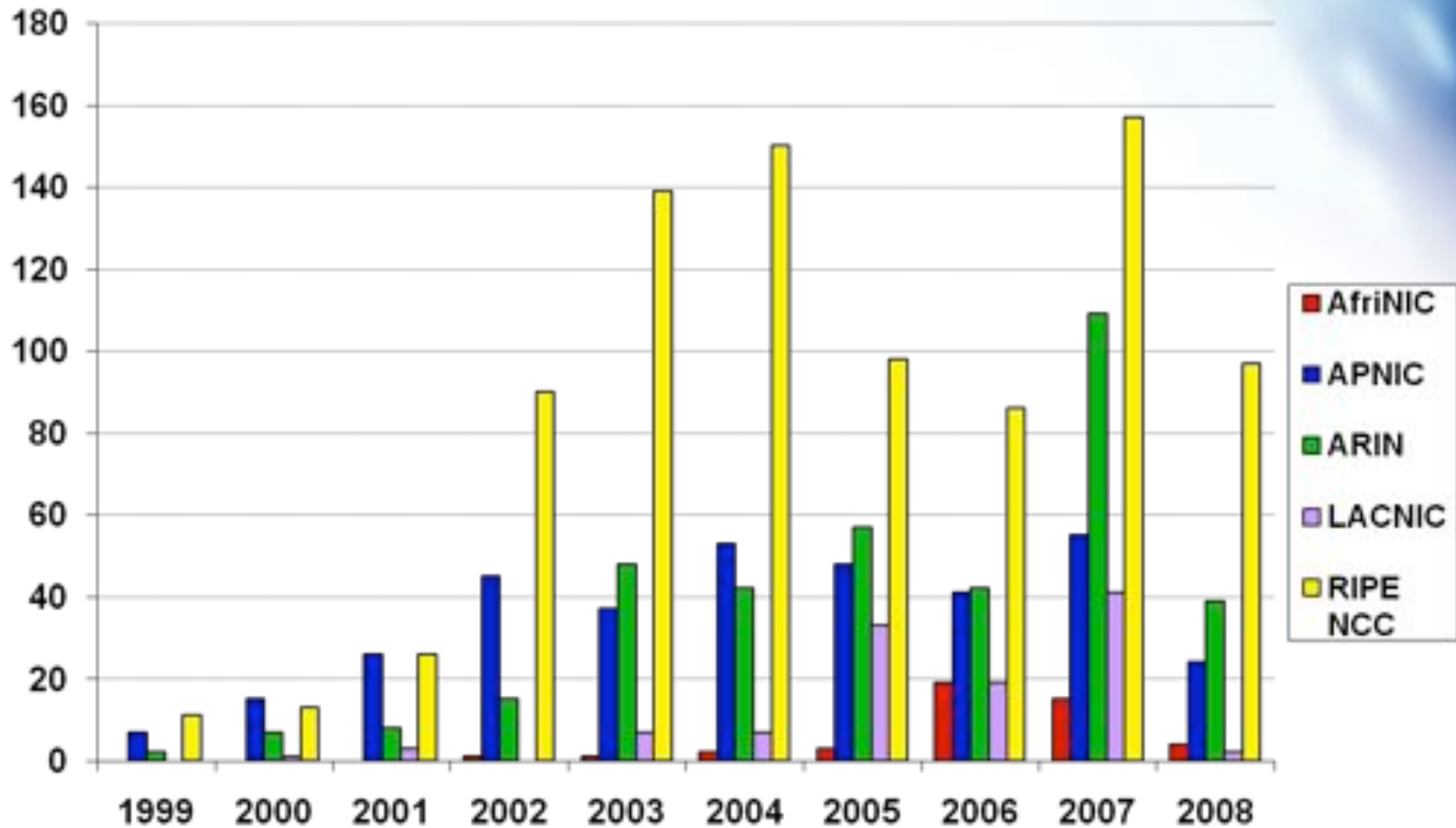

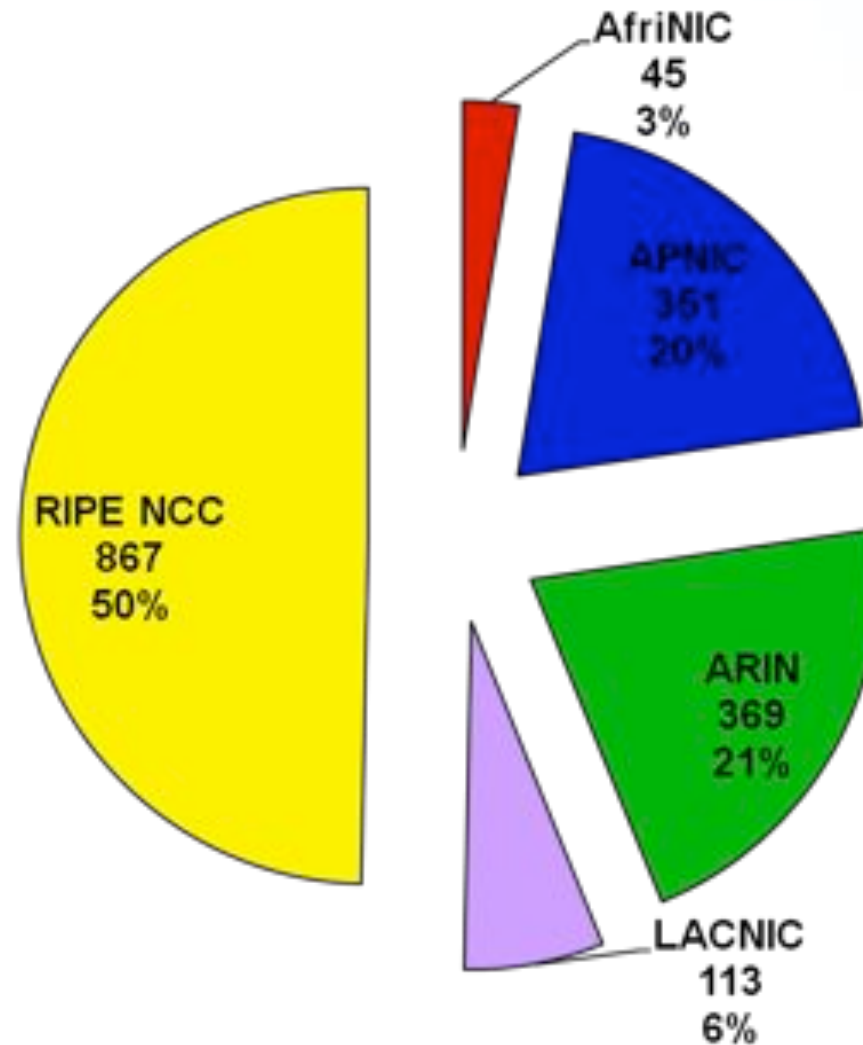
# IPv6 Allocations: RIRs to LIRs/ISPs

Yearly comparison – data up to Mar 2008

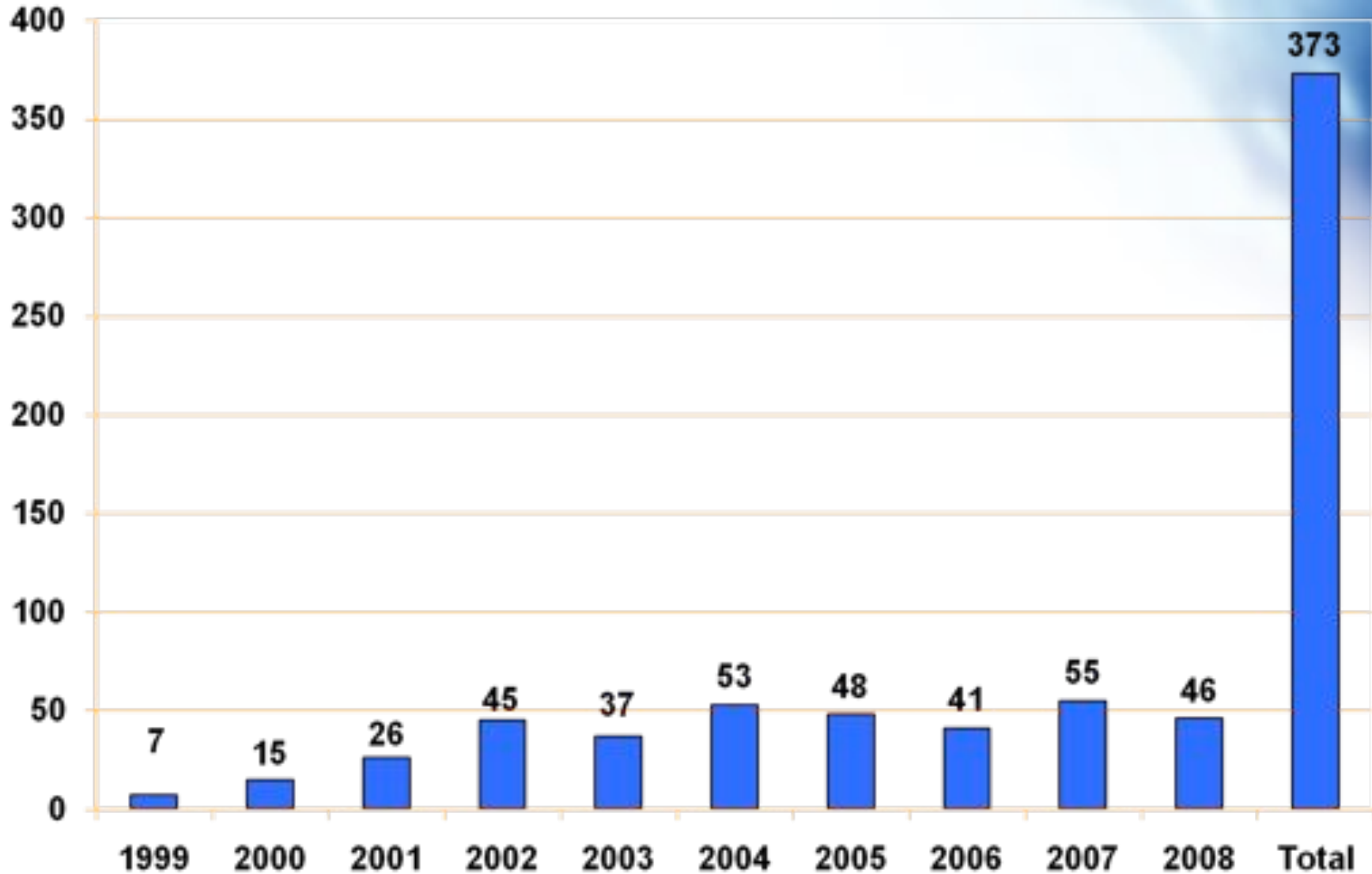


# IPv6 allocations RIRs to LIRs/ISPs

Cumulative total (Jan 1999 – Mar 2008)



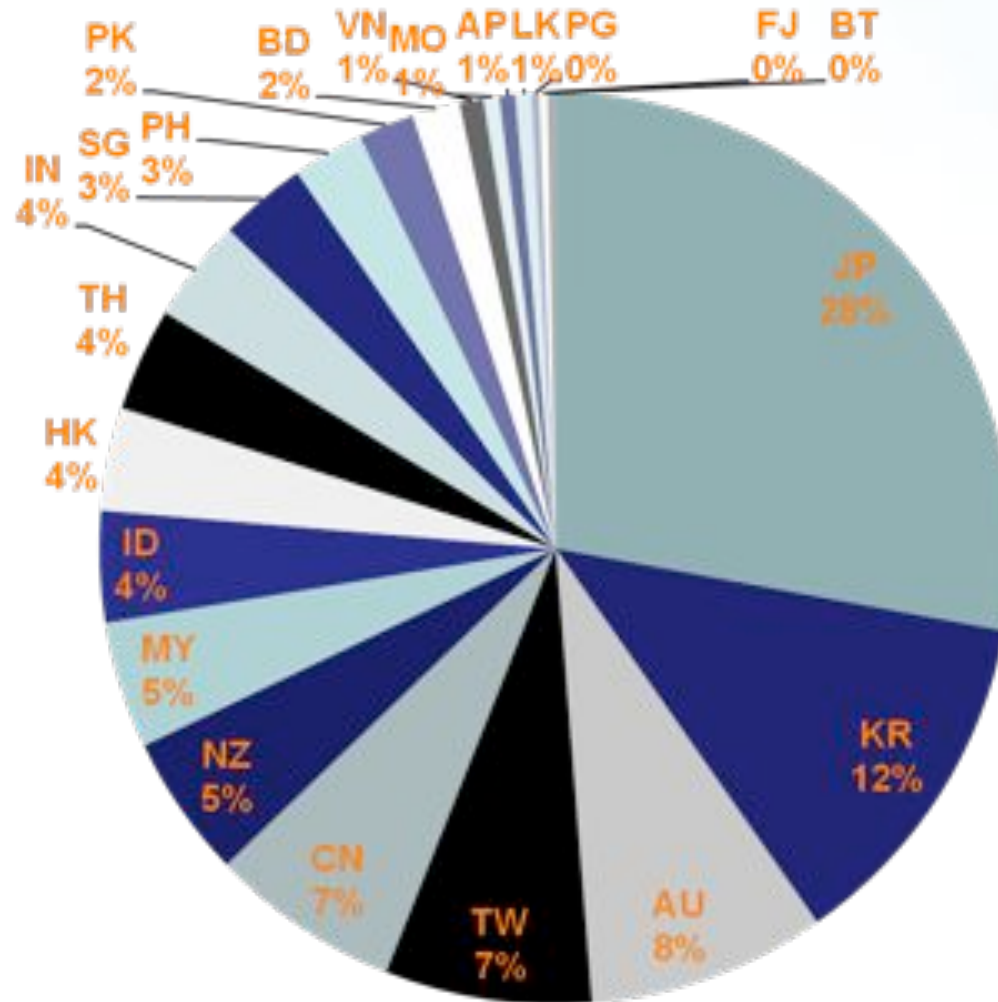
# APNIC IPv6 delegations by year (allocation)

# Recently implemented policies (August 2008)

- prop-053: Changing minimum IPv4 allocation size to /22
  - The minimum IPv4 allocation size was reduced from /21 to /22
- prop-057: Proposal to change IPv6 initial allocation criteria
  - Current LIRs with an existing IPv4 allocation from APNIC or an NIR can now justify an IPv6 initial allocation without documenting a plan for making 200 assignments.

# Recently implemented policies (February 2009)

- prop-062: Use of final /8
  - Each APNIC account holder will be eligible to request and receive a single allocation from the last remaining /8 worth of space in the unallocated pool. In addition, APNIC will reserve a /16 from the final /8 worth of space for future uses, as yet unforeseen.
- prop-066: Ensuring efficient use of historical IPv4 resources
  - All historical address allocations will be included when assessing a network's eligibility for more IPv4 addresses.

# Recently implemented policies (February 2009)

- prop-064: Change to assignment policy for AS numbers
  - From 1 July 2009, if a network requests a two-byte AS number from APNIC, the network will need to document why it cannot use a four-byte AS number.

# Policy proposals at APNIC 27

- IPv4 transfer proposals
  - prop-050: IPv4 address transfers
  - prop-067: A simple transfer proposal
- Discussion on proposals continuing from APNIC 26:
  - prop-060: Change in the criteria for the recognition of NIRs in the APNIC region
  - prop-063: Reducing timeframe of IPv4 allocations from twelve to six months

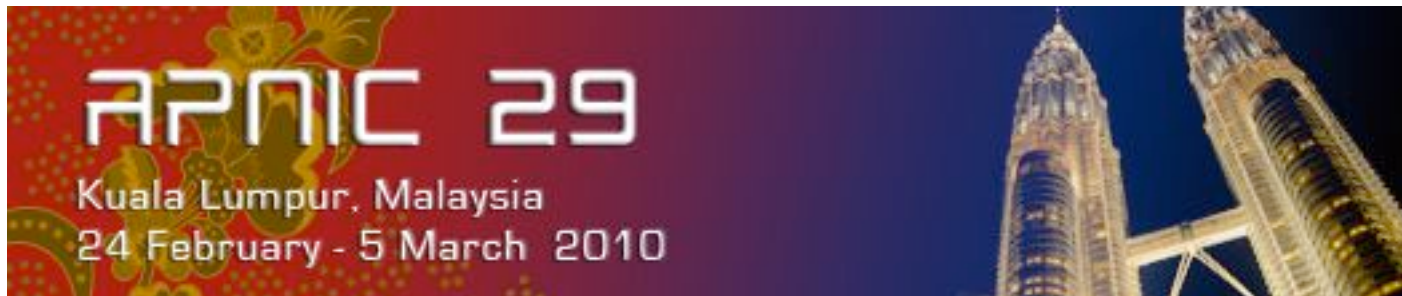
