### Internet Operations Groups

- Where network engineers and operators meet their colleagues
  - Peering & Business relationships
  - Industry relationship
  - Technology discussions
  - Operational best practices
  - Compare experiences (supplier, operational,...)
  - Purchasing decisions influenced
  - Networking software features worked out
  - Employment opportunities
  - Keeping the Internet Working





- African Ops Conference
  - Established in 2000
  - Still centred around Workshops, based on the now defunct INET Workshops organised by ISOC
  - Co-located with one of two AfriNIC meetings
- Meets once per year in April/May
- Typical attendance around 100
- Moves around Africa
  - 2009 was in Cairo, Egypt
  - 2010 was in Kigali, Rwanda





- Programme
  - 5 days of workshops
    - 4 parallel workshops including System Administration,
       Scalable Services and Scalable Infrastructure
  - 2 days of tutorials
    - 3 parallel tutorials, usually more detailed content than the workshops
  - 1 day of conference

#### APRICOT 2010

- Kuala Lumpur, 23rd February 5th March
- 734 participants from 53 countries
- 5 days of workshop, 5 days of tutorial & conference
  - Includes APNIC Member Meeting
- Workshops included:
  - 2x IPv4/v6 Routing, Network Management, VoIP, ISP Security, MPLS, Multicast

## APRICOT (2)

- APRICOT 2011
  - Hong Kong, 15th 25th February
  - Will be held jointly with APAN 31
- APRICOT 2012
  - New Delhi, 22nd February 3rd March
  - SANOG 19 will be part of APRICOT 2012
- Forward planning is vital
  - Work starts 9 months prior to the event
  - Future host MUST participate on organisation committee and organisation activities of the prior event





- Two meetings per year in the Middle East
- MENOG 5
  - 25th 29th October 2009 in Beirut
  - Two 3 day workshops
    - IPv4/v6 Routing & ISP Security
  - 180 attendees from 29 countries
- MENOG 6
  - 10th 14th April 2010 in Riyadh
  - Two 3 day workshops
    - IPv4/v6 Routing & Robust DNS Infrastructure
  - 140 attendees from 19 countries





#### MENOG 7

- 21st 29th October 2010 in Istanbul, Turkey
- Edge of region, but strong interest from the industry to host the event
- MENOG 8 and 9
  - Following MENOG 5, countries including Jordan and Syria expressed interest in hosting events in 2011
- Desire to push workshops up to 5 days
  - 3 days is "too short"





- Three meetings per year in North America
  - NANOG 48
    - Austin, Texas, 21 24 February 2010
  - NANOG 49
    - San Francisco, 13 16 June 2010
  - NANOG 50
    - Atlanta, Georgia, 3 6 October 2010
  - NANOG 51
    - Miami, Florida, 30 January 2 February 2011



- Established formula of:
  - Conference plenary
  - "Birds of Feather" sessions
  - Tutorials
  - Panel discussions
- Around 500 participants
  - Depends on location
  - Programme quality
  - Forward planning





- Two meetings per year in the Pacific Islands
- PacNOG 6
  - 16th 26th November 2009 in Nadi, Fiji
  - 1 day conference, 8 days of workshops
  - Workshops included:
    - IPv4/v6 Routing, System Admin, VoIP, IXP & Peering

#### PacNOG 7

- 28th June 3rd July 2010, Pago Pago, American Samoa
- 1 day conference & tutorials, 5 days of workshop
- Workshops included:
  - IPv4/v6 Routing, VoIP, Network Systems, LAMP, DNS





## PacNOG (2)

- PacNOG 8
  - 22nd 27th November 2010, Pohnpei, FSM
  - First time in Micronesia, and will celebrate arrival of undersea fibre in FSM
- PacNOG 9 and 10
  - 2011 planning well under way
  - Countries interested in hosting include Solomons, New Caledonia and Tonga





- SANOG 15
  - 27th January 3rd February 2010 in Dhaka, Bangladesh
- SANOG 16
  - 15th 23rd July 2010 in Paro, Bhutan
- Standard established formula:
  - Three 5 day workshops
  - 2 days of tutorials
  - 1.5 days of conference plenary





- SANOG 17
  - Will be in Colombo, Sri Lanka
  - January 2011
- SANOG 18
  - Will be in Pokhara, Nepal
  - August/September 2011
