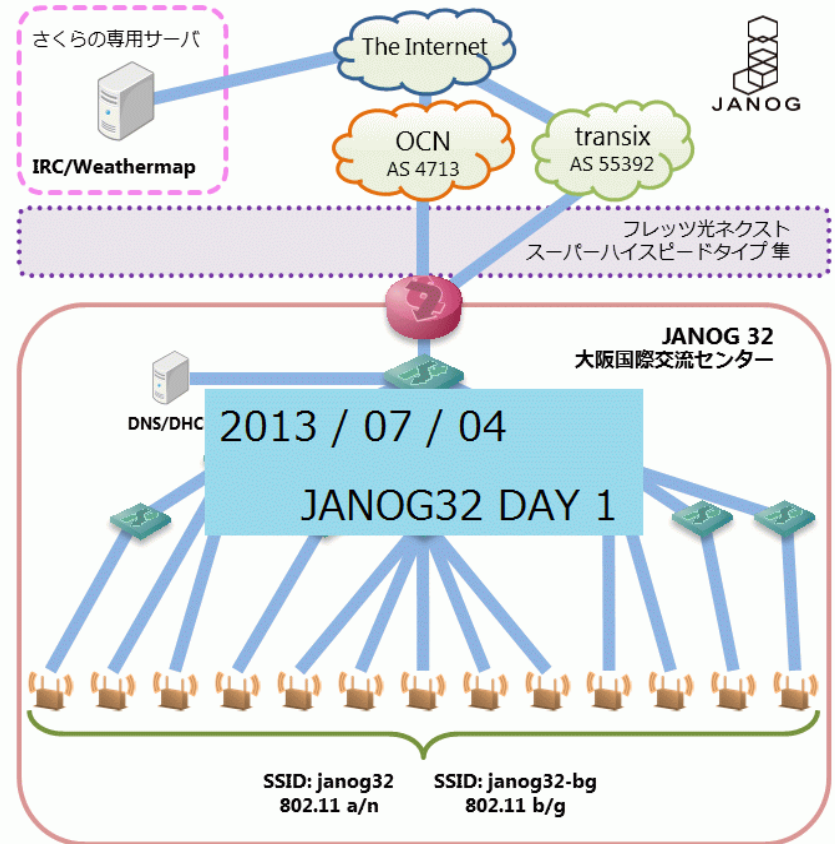
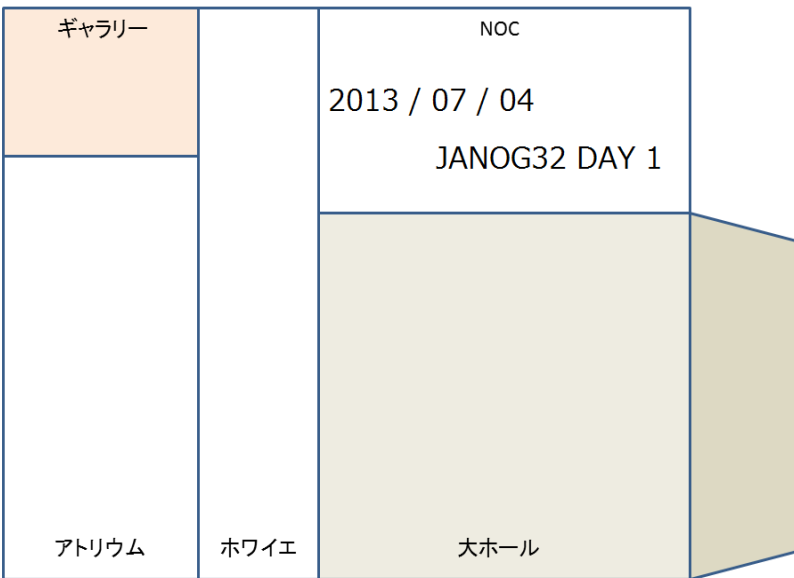
- mailing list
 - 6500 mailing list members
- face to face meeting
 - Held twice a year, usually January and July
 - 2 days of plenary sessions
 - ~800 attendees at Tokyo meetings
 - ~400 attendees at other Cities
- working group
 - temporarily formed to discuss a particular topic
 - RPKI working group

JANOG meeting

- mostly focus on discussions
- presentations and discussions are in Japanese
 - English is acceptable but rough translation is recommended
 - around 10 non-native attendees per meeting
- No registration fee for meeting
 - participants need to pay for social party
